Jenny - introduced the Speaker from the Somers Bush Kinder. Lizzie explained the program and how it involves unstructured play in a woodland environment at Coolart. They explore and play with supervision so it is very safe. All weather so they kit the kids up in puddle suits and they are allowed to explore and have small challenges and may even climb a special tree. They also involve Indigenous education which is very important to understand the connection to the land. They are passionate and pioneering the future of kinder education. They are trying to raise a shortfall of \$2,200.

The club offered to give the Kinder a stall for free at the Hastings market to help sell raffle tickets.

Somers Pre-School is located in beautiful coastal village on the Westernport Bay, close to Balnarring, Merricks, Shoreham and Red Hill.

The community of Somers enjoy an amazing natural environment and the Pre-School location boasts all of these beautiful characteristics.

In a peaceful and protected area, the Somers Pre-School is situated approximately 100 metres from the Somers beach and provides ample parking for parents. An enormous outdoor play area is protected by large gum trees which frequently play home to our local koalas. How many Australian children can boast having a koala in their kinder playground?

In 2011 Mornington Peninsula Shire Council totally refurbished the kindergarten centre. Currently the kindergarten community is excited by future plans to restructure the outdoor play space. Stage 1 will commence in 2013. **DUSH KINGER** A YEAR OLD PROGRAM Bush kinder will provide your child with the time and an ideal environment to tearn in 3 hours of uninterrupted time in the bush, using what nature has provided as learning materials. Bush kinder will be a special part of your child's Pre-School experience.

They will have the opportunity to play in natures reliable grassy mounds, balance along tallen logi, get involved in dramatic play, find insects, draw with sticks on the ground, climb trans... Through play your child will connect with the land in a way that cannot be experiented under a root or within walls.

Bush kinder sile is in the grounds of the Calegri Vellands and Homestead, and is set in a adjusous gardon with wellonds, bush, woodlands and pasture nearby.

Our goal is to create a space where all children feel safe, comfortable, confident, inspired, and challenged. We offer a flexible educational program within a homely, warm environment that recognises childhood as a special time. Our curriculum is "emergent", which means the program develops slowly over time providing many varied opportunities to nurture creative expression, critical thinking and environment awareness. Our Centre is a place where children and their families can feel a sense of belonging to the Kindergarten community.

It is young children exploring their world with sensory thoroughness, experimenting with people and places and materials, encouraged by a teacher who respects and uses their ideas and ways of learning to help them discover what has meaning for them in our society." ROTARY BRINGS FREE HEALTH SERVICES INTO UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES

Rotary clubs of South Africa, Swaziland, Lesotho, Nigeria, Uganda, and Ghana team up with NGOs, businesses and governments for Rotary Family Health Days

EVANSTON, III. (March 28, 2014) — Rotary Family Health Days – an innovative international campaign providing free health-care services to underserved families -- launches its fourth edition in April 2014, aiming to reach 350,000 people in Uganda, Nigeria, Ghana, South Africa, Swaziland and Lesotho.

Rotary Family Health Days (RFHD) promotes healthy living and disease prevention by providing free, comprehensive health-care services to tens of thousands of people in underprivileged communities. The program, led by Rotary's mobilizing arm - Rotarians for Family Health & AIDS Prevention - addresses Africa's most pressing health challenges, including HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria and reproductive health, as well as conditions such as diabetes and hypertension. An important component is immunizing children against polio, measles and other vaccine-preventable diseases.

The Rotary-led program is sponsored by The Coca-Cola Africa Foundation, the South Africa Department of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention CDC, USAID, the SABC and Caxton as primary media partners as well as YFM, Media 24 news and Independent Newspapers in the Western Cape.

RFHD launched in 2011 at 160 sites in Uganda and Kenya and immediately exceeded organizers' expectations by drawing 38,000 people to the one-day event. In 2012, Nigeria signed on and the program expanded to three days. By 2013, RFHD operated 368 sites in Uganda, Nigeria and South Africa, reaching over 275,000 people. More than 5,500 Rotary members from 362 clubs participated.

"We believe we have achieved 'proof of concept' and identified the power of our health campaign," said Marion Bunch, director and managing partner of RFHD and a Rotary club member from Georgia, USA, who became active in the fight against HIV/AIDS in Africa after losing a son to the disease, and has since expanded the scope of her efforts to address other health issues. "We have learned that when a campaign delivers several interventions at once, the benefits rise exponentially for families and communities."

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), every year millions of Africans die from diseases that are preventable and treatable. The region faces many challenges including weak and fragmented health systems, inadequate resources for delivering proven interventions, limited access to health-services and extreme poverty. Rotary Family Health Days addresses these challenges by bringing life-saving health services into the communities most at risk.




District Govenor: Tim Moore 2013 - 14


