


Message from the Presidents' Desk

Avenues of Service Chair



PlayOn Program was established by the Rotary Club of Hastings Western Port in recognition of the need for the provision of more opportunities and support for disadvantaged youth in Victoria and to assist in the prevention of harm, and to encourage their positive involvement in the community. PlayOn is a charitable trust registered as a Harm Prevention Charity and has taxation exemption status.

The general objectives of PlayOn are to:

(a) Reduce the levels of suicide, self-harm, emotional abuse, physical abuse, substance abuse and sexual abuse amongst disadvantaged youth in Victoria.

(b) Develop initiatives to, and conduct and manage programs for, the encouragement of and financing of participation in life enriching activities, including mentoring, community groups, sport, musical activities and recreational activities in Victoria by disadvantaged youth.

(c) Work in partnership with community and education groups to improve the availability and access to counselling, mentoring, and self worth programs with an aim to provide greater opportunities for disadvantaged youth.

(d) Encourage and provide opportunities for disadvantaged youth to remain in formal education programs or to progress to meaningful employment.

(e) Develop, fund and manage promotions and campaigns to raise community awareness regarding the needs of disadvantaged youth and young adults in the community, the risks to them in terms of physical and mental well-being and the ways in which PlayOn can assist the community with this process.

(f) Provide mentors, professional counsellors and other resources to eligible members of the youth community who are confronted by disadvantage, lack of opportunity or drug addiction with an aim to encouraging positive involvement with the community.

PlayOn was developed to provide special assistance to young people experiencing difficulties or hardship. Several hundred young people have to date been assisted by the program. In 2006 PlayOn was awarded the best health promotion program for young people in Victoria with a budget less than \$30,000 by VicHealth. We have assisted young people recovering from mental illness, young boys from single parent homes to play golf, young indigenous women with health and body image difficulties to join healty eating programs and a gymnasium and several young people from homes where a sibling has a serious handicap to be involved in recreational activities with one boy successfully competing in a touring international rugby team.
