Minutes from last meeting—Continued

Welcome to Hannah Lewis- Westernport Secondary - Assistant Principal

Hannah has a long association with our club. With over 21 years in the school she originally liaised with Jim Peddie in 1997. Hannah was surprised and humbled by the award. Hannah gave us an incite into her role and explained the joy she has in being the conduit between the children and the community which her role affords. Many creative opportunities and freedom to move within her role keeps her going. Her passion is the arts and she enjoys creating. The Warringine Precinct started with Jenny McCaffer from the Shire – designed to build community capacity, linking Warringine Park which is one of the best kept secrets on the Mornington Peninsula. It was declared a conservation park in 1994 and came under Mornington Peninsula Shire management in 2006. The park is divided into three sections: a Coastal Wetland, a Creekland and Woodland; all with their own special values. Located at 2230 Frankston-Flinders Road, Bittern (Melway Ref 164 E4) with the Gathering Place 'Willum Warrain' The Mornington Peninsula Aboriginal Gathering Place has been established in Hastings with support from Mornington Peninsula Shire and funding from the Closing the Gap program. The purpose of the Aboriginal Gathering Place on the Peninsula is to provide connection to community and place and enable a one stop shop service of programs and activities to link Aboriginal community members with each other and relevant services in a cultural context. The school has been involved and worked with Shire Rangers and built seats for the areas. All these programs allow for practical skills for life and built resilience.

The special garden funded by a \$5000 grant from the Shire is being created at the moment is located at the school and being built by students. The garden is meditation spiral inspirational labyrinth with formal meditation walk entered via a living arch of jasmine with seats made of reclaimed timber.

Rotary members are invited to help create pavers on the 7th October from 4-6.30pm with others from the school council and parents. Mosaics will be created with words of hope and laid as a positive message as you travel through the garden. It is hoped that the garden will be used by the community and that the school will hold formalised school tours next year adding to the education value.

A general discussion on disenfranchised youth and help and support ensued and the value of Chaplaincy at the school was discussed and Rotary member's voiced approval of the work Matt has done over the passed five years.

Another growth year with shipments for all Victorian Districts

"Due to Club support last year your Donations In Kind Store now provides our new Leaders with the greatest opportunity ever, to help people in need." This quote from the last newsletter remains the same.

It was a great year with an 18% increase in goods shipped from the Store. The volume and quality of donations increase and we are currently overstocked.



Education

The World President has asked Rotarians to focus on this area and we know how important this area is for children in developing countries.



For many students a desk and chair is still a dream that you can turn into a reality - we have furniture in stock that looks brand new many students who need our help.

It only costs \$5.00 to ship a chair and \$20.00 for a desk.

Branding This year we promoted DIK as "**Practical Rotary**". What other project generates a better return on investment? \$225,000 to deliver \$3,200,000 worth of goods 1500% return

Unprecedented Medical Aid Shipping medical equipment and supplies has been the highlight this year. Collecting 140 electric beds and other equipment from St Vincent's Hospital and loading three containers on site in two days was a great achievement and it was only possible because terrific support from many volunteers. This year we shipped 400+ beds and other medical equipment went to eleven countries.



Diversity As you can see, the spread of the projects is increasing and also Club involvement, with Club containers shipped for all Victorian and Districts and one from interstate. **Computers 4 Kids** and **Mobility and Home Aids Project** are located at the Store and receive assistance to collect and deliver equipment.

Partnerships Allow Clubs to do much more and should be considered. Some Clubs have formed relationships with schools to collect their reusable material, with great results for minimal effort. We also have well research project opportunities with detailed wishlists. Clubs can collect material or fund the shipping costs. *Contact the Store for details*



Store Funding It now costs \$50,000+ to run the Store. The Van is a wonderful resource is often working five days a week, but it is also another cost that needs to be funded. Some Clubs are great supporters and we are indebted to them; without their help there would be no Store. It's still an ongoing challenge and we need to spread the net further to get more support. An organization that is **run by Volunteers**, that **Recycles Material that would often become landfill** and **provides great Overseas Aid** is worthy of Community and Government support.
