

During Vocational Service Month, Rotarians will be rolling up their sleeves, calling on their professional and personal networks, and using their unique skills to improve their communities. Looking for inspiration for your own club or district project? Check out these projects on Rotary

#### Showcase:

- In July, the Rotary Club of Lokhandwala Kandivali, Maharashtra, India, hosted a defensive driving program to help decrease the number of vehicle accidents and traffic violations. A total of 45 taxi and private drivers participated in the interactive training.
- The Rotary Club of Colombo, Western Province, Sri Lanka, carried out a joint project with its Rotary Community Corps and the Rotary Club of Chichester Priory, West Sussex, England, to implement an English teacher training program for 160 young teachers. The trainees are now leading basic English courses at 24 schools for two hours every week.
- Forty-five young adults were selected to participate in a policy and leadership development training workshop held by the Rotaract Club of Phulbari, Nepal. The workshop, facilitated by lawyers and young entrepreneurs, included training in both theoretical and practical approaches to building young people's influence on policy, particularly in relation to youth welfare.




