

Showcase: Rotary Club of Warragul

The Rotary club of Warragul



Chartered in 1938 the Rotary club of Warragul currently has 57 members and with the club having recently celebrated 75 years in the local community the club entered into a partnership with the local authority and the two are now working together on "The Rotary park project" which will establish a playground for young children and their families and will be around for many years to

come.

The big fund raiser for the club over the years has been the growing and harvesting of Christmas trees. The project commenced way back in 1979 raising the princely sum of \$400 for the club but since then has gone from strength to strength and since that date has raised well in excess of \$250k for the club which has contributed to the many local community projects.





The club has been supporting the art community since 1973 in running Art Gippsland giving local artists the opportunity to showcase their work and at the same time bringing in funds that again benefit the local community. In the 40 or so years of Art Gippsland the club have raised a total in the region of \$350k

The club has a long history with GSE and was fortunate enough to host the Ohio team last year as well as providing a candidate for the outbound team.

The cub has a long history of youth exchange, hosting the club's first student back in 1964.

The club is again this year involved in youth exchange and will be keen to again host the inbound GSE team from Turkey. A club member will be taking up the "Kokoda challenge" and will be attempting to re-establish a Rotoract club in the area. All this is in addition to continuing with the club major projects of Christmas trees and the annual Art show.
