

POLIO VACCINE CELEBRATES 60TH ANNIVERSARY



Sunday, 12 April, marks 60 years since the Salk polio vaccine was declared safe, effective, and potent. In that time, the number of polio cases has dropped by 99 percent worldwide. With just three countries remaining polio-endemic, we are closer than ever to eradicating this crippling disease.

Jonas Salk's inactivated polio vaccine (IPV) has been crucial in helping us reach our goal of a polio-free world. Before the vaccine was widely available, in the United States alone, polio

crippled more than 35,000 people each year. By 1957 -- two years after the introduction of Salk's vaccine -- cases in the U.S. had fallen by almost 90 percent, and by 1979, polio had been eradicated there.

The impact on the rest of the world has taken longer. In 1988, when Rotary International launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) with its partners at the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, polio continued to cripple children in 125 countries. Today, polio remains endemic in only three: Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan. And it has been more than eight months since Nigeria's last case, making a polio-free Africa a real possibility.

Salk's vaccine will play an important role in the end-game strategy against polio when 120 countries introduce IPV into their routine polio immunization systems this year. Leading that effort are the GPEI partners and Gavi, a global vaccine alliance, along with Sanofi Pasteur, the largest manufacturer of polio vaccine.

"As more than 120 countries in the world are introducing IPV, we are beginning the last chapter on polio eradication," said Olivier Charmeil, Sanofi Pasteur's chief executive officer. "At Sanofi Pasteur, we have had a long-term vision of IPV as the ultimate public health tool able to finish the job started with Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV)."

Rotarians never cease to amaze me! This month I have shared in fund raising events, been involved in final Conference planning and heard some exciting Rotary stories. I was invited to be present at one Club where a large cheque to be handed over for Motor Neurone Disease research...a good news story that turned out to be a classic case of starting a conversation, joining the dots and bringing parties together for a super outcome. The conversation between the Pakenham Inner Wheel and Rotary Clubs regarding Motor Neurone Disease fund raising and research grew to someone drawing in a third party, introducing that person to a fourth party (researchers)and creating an outcome whereby a five year funding agreement resulted in a cheque for \$3 million – yes, you're reading it correctly! – handed over from the Stafford Fox Medical Research Foundation to the Florey Research Institute to accelerate research into finding a cure for Motor Neurone Disease. Well done to all concerned – you continue to LIGHT UP ROTARY

With March being Literacy Month, I am happy to let you know that we have progressed literacy within our own country by supporting a Global Grant to access Library books for an indigenous community near Cairns in Queensland. This is a slightly different use for a Global Grant being used in Australia rather than overseas but desperately needed nonetheless.

As Presidents, remember that statements towards Presidential Citations close at the end of March – at this point of time I only have a few so please consider the work done by your Club during the year and even if you are unsure, it costs nothing to forward the completed brochure to me. If I have any questions or queries I will contact you to clarify potential areas of possibility. As you would be aware, Vanuatu has been devastated by the recent weather event and as we usually do, D9820 is already looking at how best to use some of our Emergency moneys toward the RAWCS fund. This has been put together by the District Governors in Australia after a very legitimate looking email was circulated requesting monetary donations from a reliable source, but which turned out to be a scam. As a result, an immediate RAWCS fund was introduced. Disaster Aid Australia has also moved quickly to look at how best it can provide support at this time. As we tend to do, however, D9820 has held back on offers of any other aid until the need is known more fully and the country moves into recovery mode. Watch this space. We have Clubs in the District which already have operations in Vanuatu and they are also keeping their ears and eyes open for areas of opportunity to assist.



Prior to the District Rotary Conference for the past 14 years a group of Rotarians and friends together with the Youth Exchange students have push-bike ridden to conference, individuals get their own sponsors and over 6 days ride 600km.

The Ride to Conference has raised over \$700,000 with funds supporting Primary School Life Education Program, Disaster Aid and Rotary Centenary House in Gippsland. This year the Jared Dunscombe Foundation was added to the list of recipients. Jared, a car accident victim when he was a child leaving him with physical and mental problems, was a determined very likable young man who was unfortunately killed during a Ride to Conference in Geelong a while ago. Jared's parents, Past Presidents of Cranbourne RC, set up the Foundation, please look at www.jaredfund.org.au for more information about this remarkable young man, his life, his demise and his legacy. During this last weekend's District Rotary Conference there was an excellent presentation on ROMAC which included a description of a recent case from Timor Leste of an eleven year old girl with a huge facial tumour she had had since very early in her life, she was brought to Victoria (Monash) has had multiple operations rebuilding her face after the tumour was removed over a period of eight months. This was sponsored by the Jared Dunscombe Foundation, in fact the Dunscombes' boarded them and looked after them the whole time - a fantastic humanitarian effort.
